Day 1 - Boston, MA

Day 2 - Plymouth, MA

Founded in 1620, Plymouth, MA, this coastal town was the site of the first Pilgrim settlement. With a quintessential New England feel, Plymouth County is has some of the most renowned historical monuments and beautiful coastal landscapes in the country. Explore the distinguished Massachusetts Maritime Academy and nearby Hyannis, site of the Kennedy Compound.

Massachusetts Maritime Academy - Complimentary Excursion

During this privileged excursion, explore the impressive campus and immerse yourself in its state-of-the-art, 360-degree full bridge simulator, view the Emergency Response Operations Training Center, and learn about the Academy's green technologies while standing at the base of its massive 280-foot wind turbine.

Enjoy a presentation by The Chatham Marconi Maritime Center which celebrates the rich history of 20th Century maritime radio and explores the advances in science and technology that continue to transform our lives.

The Hyannis Experience

During this carefully curated excursion, explore the charming village of Hyannis with stops at the John F. Kennedy Hyannis Museum, Veterans Memorial Park, Cape Cod Maritime Museum, and St. Francis Xavier Church. Take time to stroll down picturesque Main Street and peruse some of the many locally-owned shops. Lunch is included.

Historic Patuxet and Plymouth Colony

A walking tour presented by Plimoth Patuxet Museums has been customized to connect your Plymouth experience to America's Founding Story. Visit Plymouth Rock, Cole's Hill and Massasoit's Statue; Leyden Street (original street of Plymouth Colony), Governor Bradford's statue, Brewster Gardens and Town Brook (water supply for the Pilgrims) and Town Square and Burial Hill (location of the Fort/Meeting House).

Step aboard the historic Mayflower II. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Mayflower II is a full-scale replica of the 17th-century merchant ship that brought the Pilgrims in 1620. Also, see and learn how corn was stone-ground in 1636 at the Plimoth Grist Mill. Then, enjoy taking home a piece of history with freshly made cornmeal available for purchase at one of the 3 retails stores along the waterfront. Stop at the mill to purchase Plimoth artisan products.

Day 3 - Newport, RI

Nestled within Narragansett Bay is Newport, the yachting capital of the world. As you stroll along the beautiful beaches, historic neighborhoods, bustling wharves, and scenic waterfront, you will find Newport offers something for everyone. Visit the Herreshoff Marine Museum and America's Cup Hall of Fame. Explore Newport's fabled past with glimpses of opulent seaside estates along the "Avenue of the Mansions."

Fort Adams Exploration - Complimentary Excursion

Visit Fort Adams, the well-known fort used to protect the harbor, and puts us just a short ride away from Newport's bustling riverfront. View the "Officer's Quarters" and ascend to the scenic overlook for a breathtaking view of Newport Harbor. Learn about past and future plans for the restoration of the Fort and enter the restored casemates to visit the latest historical exhibit. The listening tunnels beneath the walls of the Fort are a marvel of architecture and engineering and represent 180 years of American military history and culture.

Avenue of the Mansions

Travel back in time to the epicenter of 19th-century opulence as a knowledgeable guide takes you down one of the most architecturally impressive avenues in the world. Learn about the owners of the homes and their monetary successes as you travel along the spectacular Ocean View Drive and Bellevue Avenue, stopping at the "grande dame" of them all, The Breakers Mansion. A portrayal of the social and financial prominence of the Vanderbilt family at the turn of the century, the architecture of this seventy-room Italian Renaissance-style palazzo is remarkable. Take a leisurely audio tour of the home and learn about the Vanderbilt family and the inspiration for their building this impressive summer "cottage." At the conclusion of the tour, you will have time to explore the bustling Newport waterfront at your leisure.

Day 4 - New London/Mystic, CT

Dating back to the Revolutionary War, New London has been the backdrop of some of the most significant scenes in American History and was once the second largest whaling port in the world. Learn about the city's storied past, which has been preserved and honored at historical landmarks and museums. Visit nearby Mystic, home to the nation's leading maritime museum, as well as an amazing aquarium, showcasing thousands of animals, from beluga whales to African penguins.

New London Harbor & the United States Coast Guard Academy

Travel by motorcoach to see the main highlights of this charming port city. Drive through Main Street viewing New London's top sights, iconic landmarks, and unique neighborhoods. Stop by Fort Trumbull, built to protect the New London Harbor from British attack, later serving as part of the country's coastal defense system. Venture to The United States Coast Guard Academy for a walking tour with a local guide.

Mystic Aquarium

Visit one of the nation's leading aquariums. Learn about our ocean planet, while exploring the many indoor and outdoor exhibits. Feed a ray, see the only spotted seals in the continental United States, experience a California sea lion show, visit African penguin chicks, and more.

Mystic Seaport Exploration

Visit Mystic Seaport Museum, the nation's leading maritime museum, with 19 acres situated along the Mystic River. Step aboard the 1841 whaleship *Charles W. Morgan*, a designated National Historic Landmark and the last wooden whaleship in the world. Explore a recreated 19th-century seafaring village, where you can meet blacksmiths, coopers, printers, and carvers hard at work. Discover world-class exhibitions of history, art, and more in one of the onsite galleries.

Day 5 - Old Saybrook, CT

Travel to Old Saybrook, located where the Connecticut River meets Long Island Sound. Settled in 1635, it is one of Connecticut's oldest towns and was the longtime residence of actress Katherine Hepburn. Explore the nearby town of Essex and stroll along the scenic waterfront, ornamented with early colonial and federal architecture lining the storybook streets. Visit the Connecticut River Museum to gain an understanding of the town's maritime history and venture to the Essex Stream Train & Riverboat, the only steam train and riverboat connection in the U.S.

Florence Griswold Museum

Visit the home of Florence Griswold, where the Old Lyme Art Colony flourished in the early 1900s. Designated a National Historic Landmark in 1993, the museum brings to life the work of American Impressionist artists in the place where they once lived and painted. Explore this remarkable campus which encompasses 12-acres of historic buildings, grounds, gardens, and walking trails.

Essex Steam Train & Riverboat

Travel to The Valley Railroad, a heritage railroad founded in 1868. Get onboard a vintage coach as a steam locomotive pulls you through the quintessential New England towns of Deep River and Chester. Next, board the *Becky Thatcher* riverboat for a cruise along the scenic Connecticut River. Travel by the historic Gillette Castle, Goodspeed Opera House, and the Haddam Swing Bridge. Upon *Becky's* return to Deep River Landing, the steam train will welcome you back on board for the return trip to Essex Station.

Day 6 - Sag Harbor, NY

Described as one of the best-kept-secret small towns on Long Island, Sag Harbor is proud of its history and works hard to preserve, commemorate, and share their past. Settled in the early 1700s, Sag Harbor had the first commercial port in the United States, the first newspaper printed on Long Island, and the first volunteer fire company in New York. Take a leisurely stroll down Main Street, visiting the unique shops and basking in the artsy ambiance of the village.

Sag Harbor Whaling & Historical Museum

Sag Harbor was once the 6th largest whaling fleet in the nation, and the largest in New York State. Discover this small, engaging museum, which features artifacts from the whaling days of Sag Harbor, including navigational tools, scrimshaw, model ships, and changing exhibits throughout the year.

Sag Harbor On Your Own – Complimentary Excursion

Sag Harbor is truly one of Long Island's hidden gems. Stroll down Main Street and discover the many unique boutiques and mouthwatering restaurants. Art enthusiasts will enjoy perusing the variety of galleries around the village. Wine connoisseurs can sip away happily at one of the local wine bars.

Day 7 - Port Jefferson, NY

Discover this waterfront town which perfectly blends natural beauty with a rich maritime heritage. Settled in the 1600s as a rural town, Port Jefferson transitioned into a shipbuilding center in the 1800s, eventually becoming the largest shipbuilding industry in Suffolk County. Admire the magnificent historic buildings and homes that once belonged to prominent sailors and shipbuilders. Visit The Village Center which was formerly a shipyard, where builders worked tirelessly to create and immediately launch ships into the Long Island Sound. Well-known circus owner P.T. Barnum once owned land running through the Village.

New York Harbor Cruise - Premium

Enjoy an evening cruise on the New York Harbor. Along the way cruise close to the iconic Statute of Liberty, lit up against the starry night sky. View the beautiful sparkling New York City Skyline and iconic landmarks such as the Brooklyn Bridge, Freedom Towers, Ellis Island, and more.

Mather House Museum

Port Jefferson was first settled in the 17th century and remained a rural community until its development as an active shipbuilding center in the mid-19th century. Explore the Mather House Museum Complex, which features the home of the Mather family, prominent 19th-century Port Jefferson shipbuilders, a Marine Barn & Sail Loft, the Thomas Jefferson Perennial Garden, and more.

Port Jefferson Brewing Company Exploration

Enjoy Port Jefferson's only hops brewery, located in the heart of the village, directly across from a bustling ferry landing. Sample their wide variety of beers in the nautical-themed tasting room which offers 12 taps pouring from a handsomely handcrafted wooden-boat bar.

Day 8 - New York, NY

End your journey in the city the never sleeps. From the bright lights of Time Square to the grand elms of Central Park and luxurious boutiques and cobblestone streets of SoHo, Manhattan does not disappoint. As you approach the most recognizable skyline in the world, reflect on your incredible adventure and all the friends and memories made.

New York, New York & The World Trade Center Experience

Board a motorcoach bound for some of the most interesting and important places in the founding of NYC, including views of the United Nations, Manhattan Municipal Building, Washington Square Park, and famous neighborhoods like The Village to name a few.
